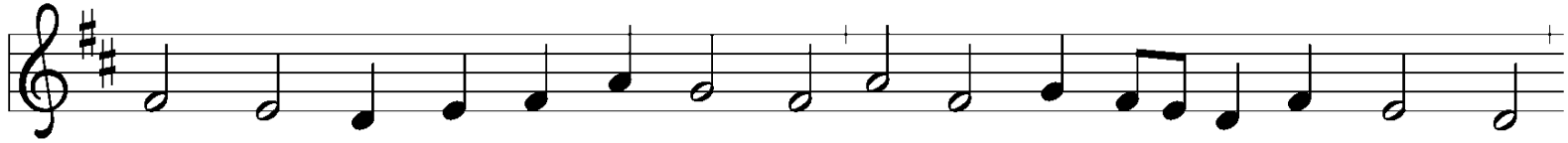




The Great Thanksgiving

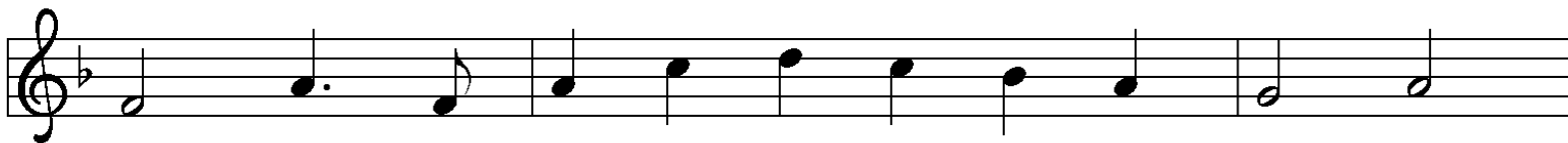

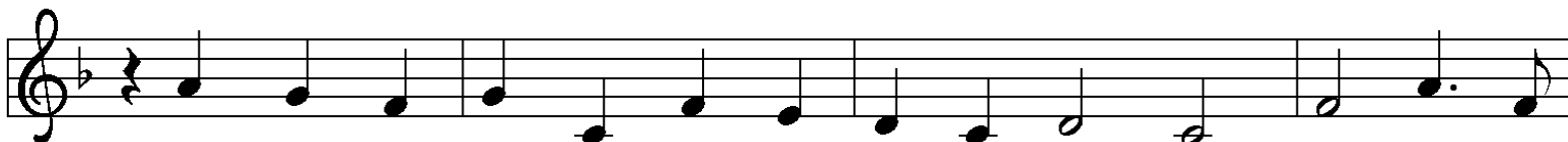
